#### **COVID Household Contacts**

Students who are household contacts of a COVID-19 case are not required to quarantine. It is required that household contacts undertake **daily** rapid antigen testing five times within the 7 days of exposure. Students from Years 3 and above, who are household contacts, are required to wear face masks when indoors at school. (We also recommend the wearing of masks for

Foundation to Year 2 students). This does not apply to students who have a valid exemption. If your child returns a positive RAT result during this period, they must stay home for 7 days, and then only leave home once they feel well. We also remind parents to contact the office and / or the classroom teacher if your child is absent so that we have all the necessary details on file.

#### <u>NAPLAN</u>

Our Year 3s and Year 5s have made an excellent start to their NAPLAN national literacy and numeracy assessments and are settling into the routines well. There have been a number of students who have been absent due to illness this week. We will provide make-up sessions, where possible, for the students who were away.

### 2023 Year 7 Secondary School Application Forms

A reminder to our Year 6 parents that secondary school applications need to be completed and returned to school by **tomorrow—Friday 13<sup>th</sup> May**.

#### Pupil Free Days — Friday 27th and Monday 30th May

The Department of Education allows each school to have 4 pupil free days per year. Recently the Department of Education notified the school that we will be given a Professional Practice Day to take as an additional pupil free day. Therefore, **this term we will have 2 pupil free days on Friday 27<sup>th</sup> May and Monday 30<sup>th</sup> May.** These dates fit in well around the body of

work that the teachers will be completing during these days and also will cause the least disruption to parents, by making it a long weekend. We apologise for the short notice, however we were made aware of this very late and needed to have the dates ratified by the School Council last Monday. Their Care will be available for both of these pupil free days, should parents need to book in their children.




