


Adjectives


The film is long and boring, **whereas** the book is thrilling and well written.

Misty discussed Scaffolding Literacy which focuses on the teaching of reading and writing through authentic children's literature where books are chosen for their meaningful stories and literate grammar. The day was centred around rich vocabulary and how we as staff can help support and engage every student, to inspire and create a passion for writing. Staff had the opportunity to work within their teams and discuss moving forward for term 2.

Teachers walked away motivated and inspired, bursting with new ideas for their students back in the classroom. We look forward to sharing these ideas with you all next term.



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
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
