The posts for these shade sails have been installed and we are now awaiting the sail to be measured and installed. These shade sails are part of a Victorian Government grant the school applied for to increase opportunities for students to participate in outside learning. These shade sails will provide the students and parents with a fantastic space for us to gather outside while staying safe from the

sun's rays.



Solar Panels

This week the school began the deconstruction of the current solar system that is installed on the roof of the school. This solar system has not been functioning for many years and we have been given approval to remove this system and replace it with a brand new functioning system. The new solar panels will be installed on the gym roof and will provide the school with a fantastic source of renewable energy to help power our school.

On Thursday 15th September we celebrated our Footy Day. Students were encouraged to dress up in the colours of their favourite sports team and participated in student-run sports activities, a parade, a staff vs students AFL Match and a special Footy themed lunch ordered through our canteen. YEAR 3 WILLUM WARRAIN EXCURSION

Making links with our PYP inquiry 'Where we are in place and time,' Year 3 students built on their knowledge of Aboriginal cultures and history visiting the Willum Warrain ("home by the sea") Aboriginal Association in Hastings. The excursion made important links for students' classroom learning and the Visual Arts program.

We were welcomed 'Wominjeka' (which means 'welcome' or 'hello' in Boonwurrung) by Auntie Ann and Uncle Peter. Willum Warrain is a 'deadly' (which means 'really cool') place. We learnt so much about Aboriginal culture and beliefs.

Did you know:

- An Aboriginal tribe is called a 'mob' or 'language group'.
- There were over 250 language groups across Australia each with their own customs and beliefs.

We were very excited to see a real possum skin cloak. Aboriginal people from the colder states of Australia wore possum skin cloaks to keep them warm and for ceremonies. They were wrapped in a possum skin cloak when they were born. The underside of a possum skin cloak has your 'story' burnt into it and it is added to throughout your life. As you grew older more skins were added so it would fit you. You were wrapped in your cloak when you died.

We were able to climb inside a 'humpy' - a hut made for people who live in the hotter parts of Australia.

We learnt about the importance of weaving to make bags and baskets and necklaces. A 'coolamon' is a carved wooden dish to carry food and for carrying babies in.

We learned about a 'scat' tree. The piece cut out could have been used for a shield or for a 'coolamon' to carry your baby or a really big one might have been cut for a canoe.

Aboriginal people have lots of knowledge about the land and how we can look after and use it. We smelled peppermint gum leaves which are good for colds.

Uncle Peter talked to us about the importance of storytelling in Aboriginal culture and showing respect, thankfulness and appreciation. He told us a story about the dolphins, sea eagle and the mullet. The story taught us how important it is to take only what you need from nature, to show thanks for what you have been given and think about the effects of what you do for the future.

Thankyou Willum Warrain for sharing so much about your amazing cultures with us.




